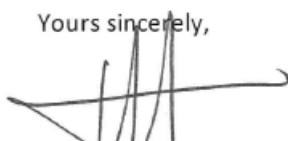

Payments can be made at the Front Office by Cash/Card.

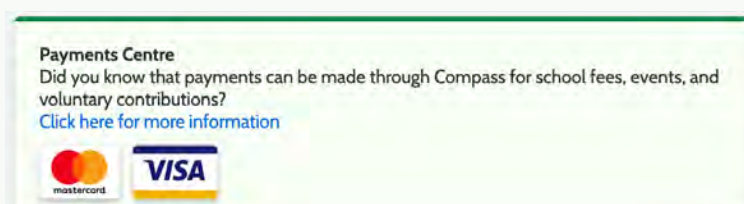


How to make payments on Compass

Step 1: Log into your Parent Compass Portal unihigh-vic.compass.education using your Parent Compass Username and Password.

Step 2: On your Compass Homepage, you will see **Payments Centre** click on **"Click here for more information"**.

Step 3: Follow the Compass prompts and instructions to make the payment. You will have option to Pay in Full or Pay in Contributions. Please click on the drop-down menu if you select to Pay in Contributions.

Refunds - Excursions, Camps and Instrumental Music

All Camps, excursions and incursions are fully self-funded. On site activities and incursions at the school will not be refunded in the case of absence or withdrawal. One day excursions will not be refunded in the case of absence or withdrawal.

- Camps – Students withdrawing from Camp will not automatically be entitled to a refund. In the case of illness or withdrawal, there may be a chance of a partial refund where the Principal or Principal's delegate deems the student's withdrawal was unavoidable. Proof of the reason for withdrawal may be requested in such circumstances.
- Students are covered by VMIA Insurance for the camp and any refund requests must be applied for through VMIA.
- To be eligible to make a claim we require a medical practitioner to certify that the attendance of the Insured Person is necessary for the health or treatment of that person (e.g. medical certificate).
- Tax Deductible Donations are unable to be refunded once an official tax-deductible receipt has been issued.
- Instrumental Music - Where a family has requested a refund for any part of the Instrumental Music levy, consideration will first be given to the costs incurred by the school in planning and arranging Instrumental Music Instruction and the cost of any non-returnable items provided to the student.

PARENT PAYMENTS POLICY

ONE PAGE OVERVIEW



FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the requirements of the Curriculum. This includes the Victorian Curriculum F-10, the Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) including the VCE Vocational Major and the Victorian Pathways Certificate.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.



PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

- Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

- Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
