



FIRST AID POLICY

PURPOSE

To ensure the school community understands our school's approach to first aid for students.

SCOPE

First aid for anaphylaxis and asthma is provided for in our school's:

- Anaphylaxis Policy
- Asthma Policy

This policy does not include information on first aid requirements for COVID-19. Our school follows the department's operational guidance for first aid management relating to COVID-19.

POLICY

From time to time University High School staff might need to administer first aid to students at school or school activities.

Parents/carers should be aware that the goal of first aid is not to diagnose or treat a condition.

Staffing

The principal ensures that University High School has sufficient staff with the appropriate levels of first aid training to meet the first aid needs of the school community.

Our school's trained first aid officers are listed in our Emergency Management Plan (EMP) and our OHS Training Planner. Our EMP includes the expiry dates of the training.

This list is reviewed on an annual basis as part of the annual review of our EMP.

First aid kits

University High School maintains:

- A major first aid kit is stored at the Story Street campus in the First Aid Treatment room (Rm 117) whilst another 29 major kits are stored across the school in key locations.
- Two major first aid kits are stored at the Lonsdale Street campus in the First Aid room (Rm 711) on Level 7 near reception.
- Portable first aid kits which may be used for excursions, camps, or yard duty include:

- 22 portable First Aid kits are stored at the Story street campus in the First Aid room - Rm117, near the General Office.
- 9 portable First Aid kits are stored at the Lonsdale street campus in First Aid room (Rm 711) near reception on Level 7

Lorraine Lane (School's First Aid Officer) is responsible for maintaining all first aid kits, ensuring they are managed in accordance with the department's policy and guidance on first aid kits - refer to [First aid kits](#).

Care for ill students

Students who are unwell should not attend school.

If a student becomes unwell during the school day they may be directed to the First Aid Room and monitored by staff. Depending on the nature of their symptoms, staff may contact parents/carers or an emergency contact person to ask them to collect the student.

First aid room/sick bay area

Our school follows the department's policy and guidance in relation to our first aid room/sick bay area to ensure it is safe, hygienic and appropriately equipped: [First aid rooms and sick bays](#).

First aid management

If there is a situation or incident which occurs at school or a school activity which requires first aid to be administered to a student:

- Staff who have been trained in first aid will administer first aid in accordance with their training. In an emergency situation, other staff may assist in the administration of first aid within their level of competence.
- In a medical emergency, staff may take emergency action and do not need to obtain parent/carer consent to do so. Staff may contact Triple Zero "000" for emergency medical services at any time.
- Staff may also contact NURSE-ON-CALL (on 1300 60 60 24) in an emergency. NURSE-ON-CALL provides immediate, expert health advice from a registered nurse and is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.
- If first aid is administered for a minor injury or condition, University High School will notify parents/carers by phone call.
- If first aid is administered for a serious injury or condition, or in an emergency situation, school staff will attempt to contact parents/carers or emergency contacts as soon as reasonably practical.
- If staff providing first aid determine that an emergency response is not required but that medical advice is needed, school staff will ask parents/carers, or an emergency contact person, to collect the student and recommend that advice is sought from a medical practitioner.
- Whenever first aid treatment is administered to a student resulting from a student incident, injury or illness, University High School will:
 - record the provision of first aid treatment using Chronicle (Compass)

- If the first aid treatment is provided following a [recorded incident](#), the details are recorded through the eduSafe Plus *Incident* form. For all other presentations, the eduSafe Plus *Sick Bay* form is used.
- follow the department's [Reporting and Managing School Incidents \(including emergencies\) Policy](#) if care was provided in response to a medical emergency or reportable incident. This includes reporting the incident to the department's Incident Support and Operations Centre on 1800 126 126 where required to under that policy.

In accordance with department policy, analgesics, including paracetamol and aspirin, are not be stored at school or provided as a standard first aid treatments. This is because they can mask signs of serious illness or injury. For further information refer to the department's Policy and Advisory Library: [Medication](#)
